

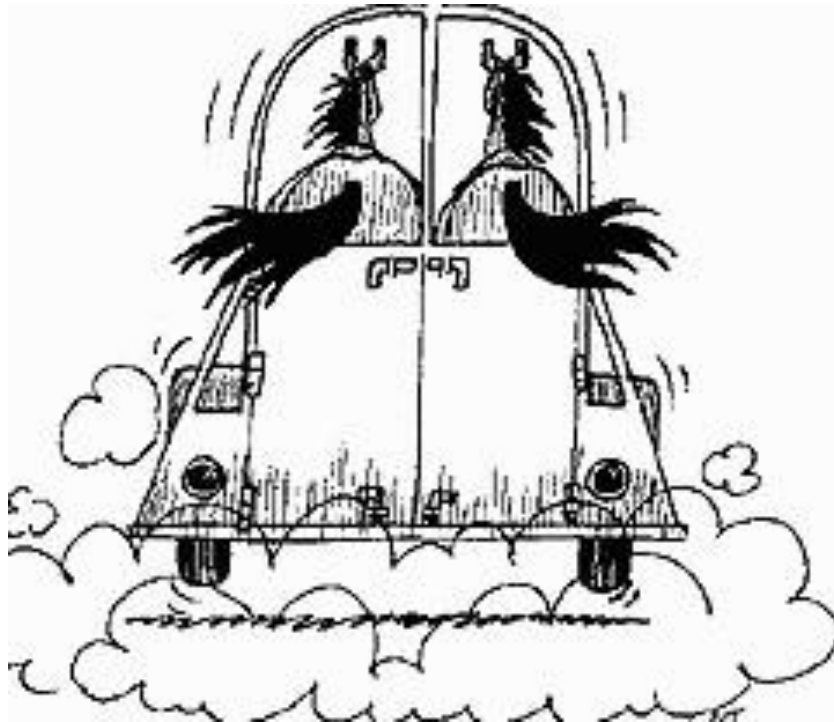

Outdoor camp kitchen available to all campers including microwave, kettle, toaster & fridge

Lessons will officially commence at 8:00am Wed 10th April. Gates will be opened for traveling riders and their families on Tuesday 9th April from 1:00pm. Upon arrival, you will be guided to your prearranged camping area and you will have immediate access to your horse yard for the duration of the camp. This yard will be allocated to you and all club members will be grouped together where possible.

There is a working bee to help set up Tuesday afternoon between 3:00-4:00pm.

Please have your PCQ Horse and Participant Health Declaration form completed upon arrival and hand to the office when you sign in. All riders MUST sign in at the office prior to gear check. A \$50 stable bond (cash) is required on arrival and will be returned on inspection of the stables at the end of the camp.

Sign in times: Tuesday 4:30-5:00pm **OR** Wednesday 7:00-7.30am.

Gear Check: Wednesday 7.45am - for the first groups and 8.45am for the second groups.

Guest Instructors plus a selection of Zone 2 instructors will be covering a range of disciplines including: Working Equitation, Pole work, vaulting, trick riding, showjumping, cross country, obstacles....

There will be a number of activities during the camp in addition to the group lessons. These include a Zone 2 Family Feast on Wednesday night - Please indicate on your nomination form the number of tickets you require. Additional tickets will be available for purchase from the canteen. Drinks will be available from the canteen.

Wednesday is 'red and white's day. Please come along in Zone 2 colours

Thursday is 'blue' day. Please come along dressed in as much blue as possible. Prizes will be awarded at the mounted presentation.

Fancy Dress on Friday.

On **Wednesday** evening there will be the Zone 2 Family Feast.

On **Thursday** evening there will be a QUIZ!

The final day of camp will be a Fancy Dress camp competition/fancy showjumping/ teams of fancy obstacle topscore This is designed to encompass what they have learned over the previous days. And have a bit of fun!

Mounted presentation to follow. Riders/Clubs are requested to bring club banners.

CAMP Code of Conduct:

All riders must have a parent or allocated guardian whilst on our grounds.

- Pony Club rules apply.
- Instructors are to be shown respect by all riders and parents at all times. Bad language and disrespectful behaviour will not be tolerated.
- Appropriate riding attire to be worn at all times. ie must be a collared shirt.
- Always be on time for your group lesson and listen to your instructor.
- NO MOBILE phones are allowed whilst participating in camp activities.
- All riders are encouraged to attempt all activities and exercises offered on camp.
- You MUST attend all activities as part of your group.
- Please be mindful of your fellow campers and keep noise to a minimum after dark.
- Please be responsible with alcohol consumption. Alcohol can only be consumed around your campsite. Please remember that you should always remain under the legal limit, in case of an emergency and you need your vehicle.
- Please ensure that you leave your camping area clean and tidy.
- No rider is to leave the grounds without first notifying zone camp organizers.
- No parents or guardians are to interrupt lessons to speak to their child unless having first spoken to the instructor. Any parent who has an issue or is dissatisfied please discuss with a representative from zone camp.
- All riders will be allocated a colour coded tag to be pinned to the near side of your saddle cloth at all times.
- Riding boots and/or closed in shoes MUST be worn around the horse pens and activities.
- All riders must report to gear check. Any unsafe gear will need to be replaced or repaired prior to joining your group.
- NO DOGS are allowed on TPC grounds during the Zone camp.
- No campsite fires
- If you have any questions or issues, please direct your concerns to the appropriate Zone camp organizer.
- One horse = one rider.
- No horses in the camp area.
- All riders MUST remain with your group all day unless you are given permission by your instructor to leave.
- There will be NO SWAPPING GROUPS without the consent of the organizing committee.
- Chewing gum or bubble gum is not permitted during camp.
- Please always ensure that your horse is fed and has access to water whilst in the yards.
- Always please be mindful that the camp is a big day for not only riders but horses as well. Allow them to rest when you can. It is a good idea to increase their fitness prior to camp.
- PLEASE WORM YOUR HORSE at least 3 days prior to commencement of camp.
- The main gate to TPC grounds MUST remain closed at all times.
- You must only WALK your horse between group lessons.
- Program is subject to change and as much notice will be given as possible if this happens.

- All yards must be completely cleaned out of manure and stable bedding. Stable bond refunds will be done after inspection by the club, at the end of the event.
- Please remove your manure to the 'poo piles' marked on your map of TPC grounds.

- **PLEASE REMEMBER YOUR SAFETY VEST IS COMPULSORY WHILST ON THE CROSS COUNTRY COURSE.**

All riders will be grouped within their classification according to age. If the activity involves jumping, groups will be organised according to their jumping ability. Please be as accurate as possible with the ratings as this will help to group riders accordingly.

FLAT WORK

1) Learner

Can walk and trot unaided

Can walk, trot and canter unaided

2) Capable

Controlled walk, trot and canter

Working to D Certificate

Has basic understanding of horse and Pony Club

3) Average

Working at diagonals and canter leads

Capable of certificate work and working at D & D* and towards C certificates

4) Average +

Knows diagonals and canter leads

Can do 15m and 20m circles

Working towards C certificate

5) Experienced

Horse and rider working competently at preliminary level

6) Advanced

Horse and rider working competently at novice/elementary level

JUMPING/CROSS COUNTRY

1) Learner

Can work with trot poles and grids

Able to walk and trot over poles and low grids

2) Capable

Grids and jumps 30-40cm at trot and canter

3) Average

Confidently jumping 40-60cms

Has good control of horse

Knowledge of and able to demonstrate

Jumping positions ie: 2 point; 3 point crutch

Some knowledge of courses eg: striding, basic rules

4) Intermediate

Competently jumping 60-80cm with control

Learning to count strides and knows positions

Has basic knowledge of competition rules and courses

5) Experienced

Competently jumping 80-100cm with confidence

Able to count strides and position established

Aiming at improving knowledge of technical side of jumping

Competing at official events/shows

6) Advanced

Competently jumping to heights at discretion of instructor

Able to shorten and lengthen between fences

**** Note****

If experienced rider and green/inexperienced horse-

do rider profile and height that horse can jump comfortably. Each rider will be individually assessed and not compared to others.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant. Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organizing committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practicing good biosecurity principles within their management. Horse Health Declarations (HHD) is a mandatory requirement for all events. Please read the HHD form and ensure:

- Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo
- Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected.
- Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organizing committee. The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD.
- Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:
 - No horses or dogs with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds
 - No communal horse water troughs are available at this event
 - Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
 - Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas.
 - Please use your own rake/shovels
 - Competitors are required to advise the event organizers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse.
 - Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitize hands between contacting different horses.
 - Not entering the grounds if you feel unwell or if you are sick
 - A site register recording all participants and support persons that enter the grounds to allow for tracking, tracing and rapid response if required
 - Adherence to the current COVID-19 Guidelines as provided by Queensland Health
 - Compliance with physical distancing and hand hygiene
 - Participants are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rakes/shovels
 - Participants are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all nonessential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse
 - Participants are required to advise the event organisers if they are leaving the grounds with a sick horse

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the organizing committee will implement our event biosecurity plan. You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organizing committee.

Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organizing committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event of horse movement restrictions participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.

If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious disease the owner/ lessee will be responsible for all vet costs and if the venue is locked down and quarantined will be responsible for all associated costs. Competitors are considered to have read and accepted these conditions when submitting a nomination.
